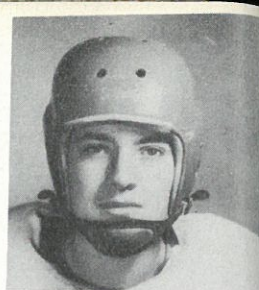
SEASON SUMMARY
