And so to you beloved parents of Ritzville High School, to you who gave our students birth, loved them, and sacrificed for them throughout the years, this annual is lovingly dedicated.





*Wants to carry his share of the load, to meet obligations, to be on his own and not cause anyone any unnecessary trouble.


*Has a sense of personal worth. He holds himself accountable for his own thoughts, feelings, and actions.

Again we held our Annual Banquet at the Grade School Cafeteria and a wonderful turkey dinner was served.


