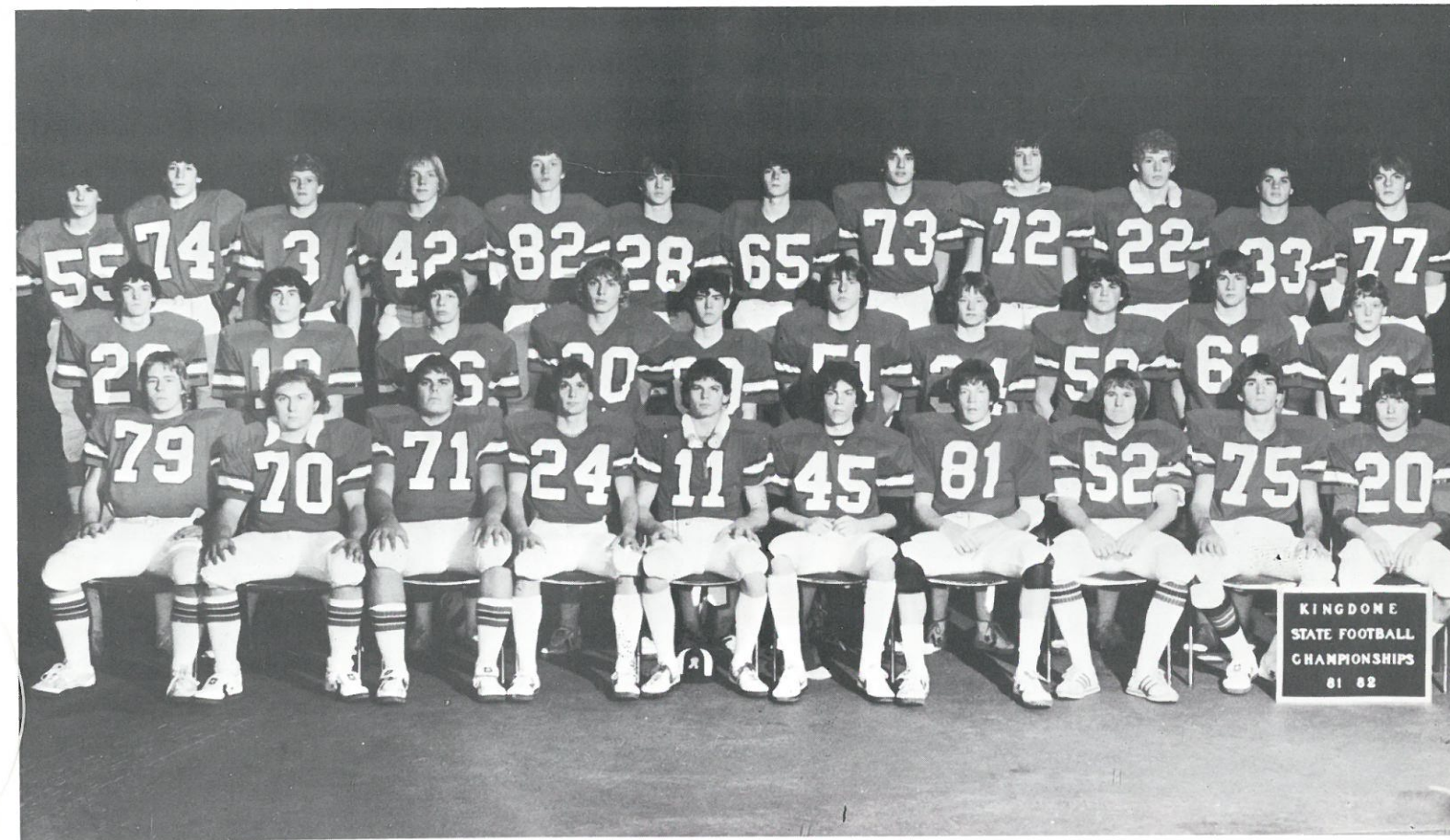

Starting the '81 football campaign as defending state champions, the Bronco gridders began the season in the same winning style as last year's edition with two wins in their first three non league starts. The broncos followed with a successful league record by downing Davenport, Reardan, and Wilbur, with a lone upset loss to the Liberty Lancers. This league record resulted in an undisputed Bi-County league championship for the Broncos. Ritzville continued their winning tradition in playoff competition, by knocking off Manson, Littitz, and Cusick, propelling them into a second straight B-11 football championship game. The Broncs fell victim to the Huskies of Morton 28 to 14, in the fifth annual Kingdome classic. A very admirable season for a very admirable team.

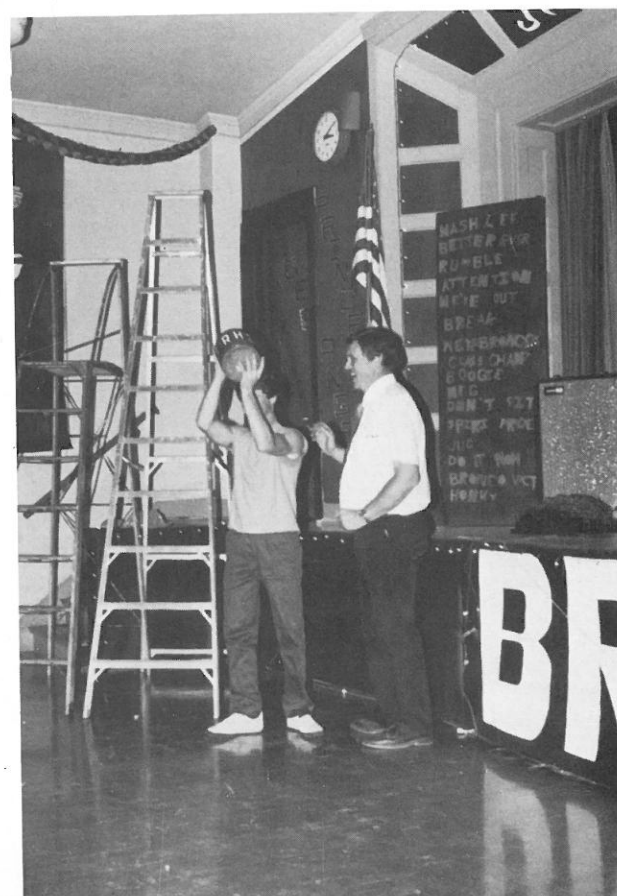
TUESDAY: Red and Black day there was no contest.

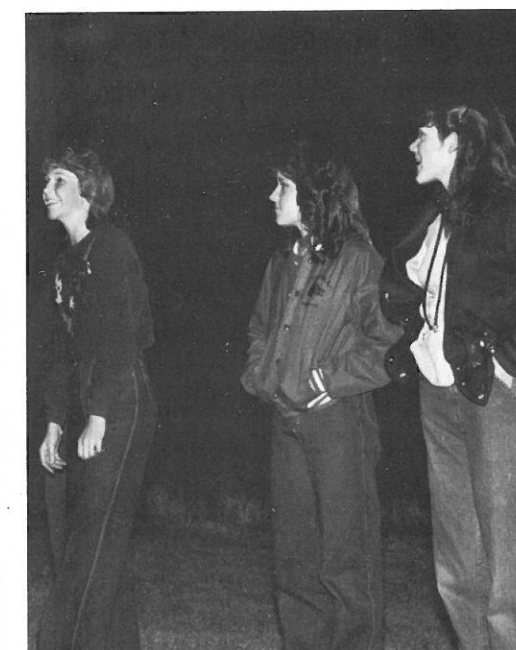

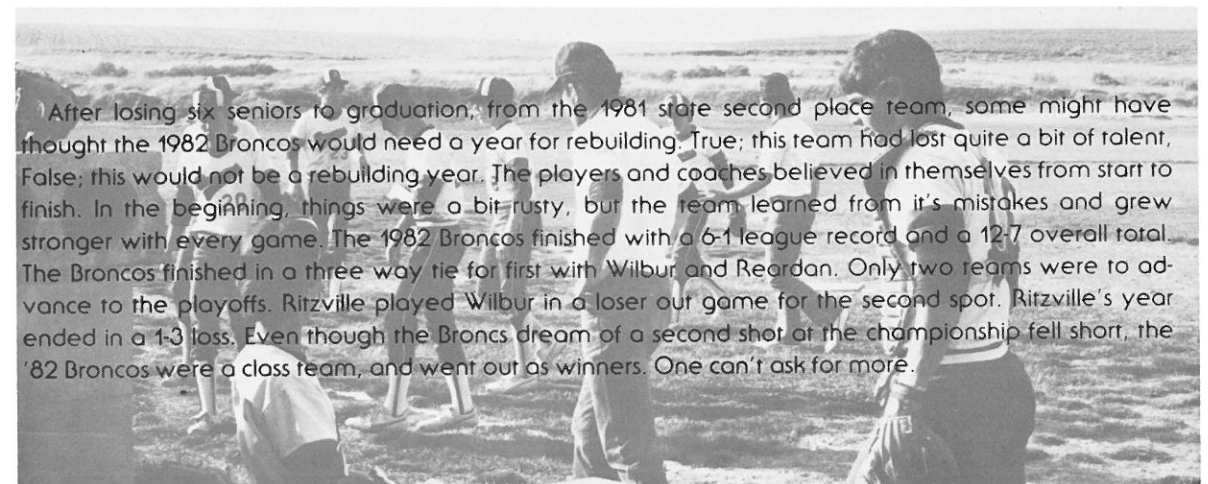
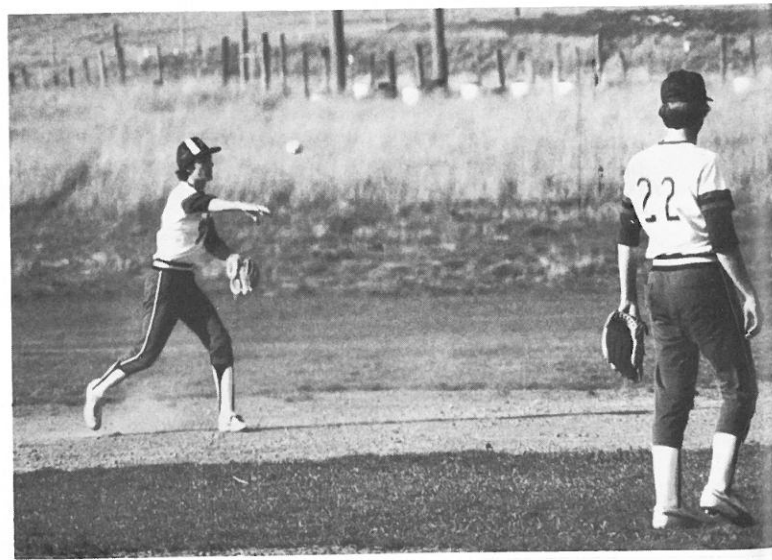

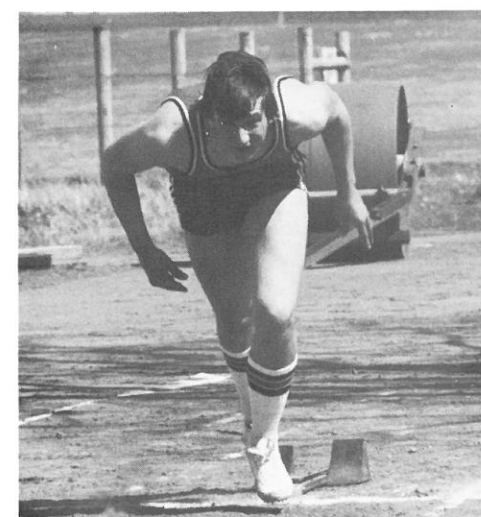

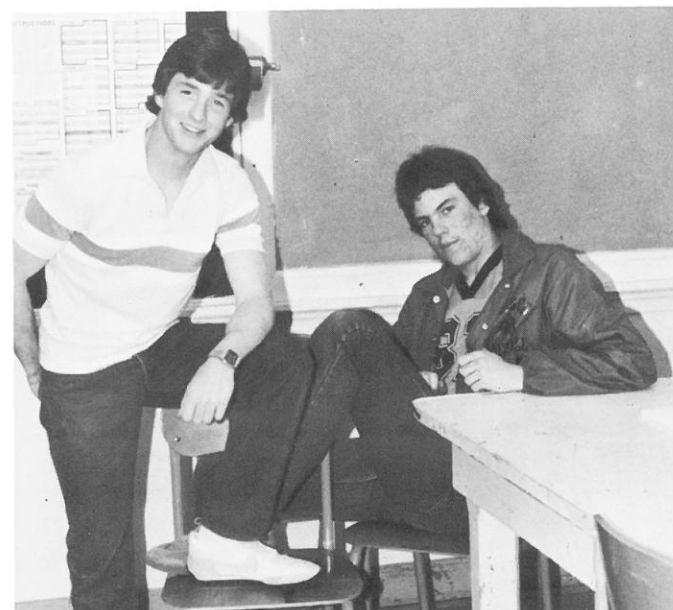
