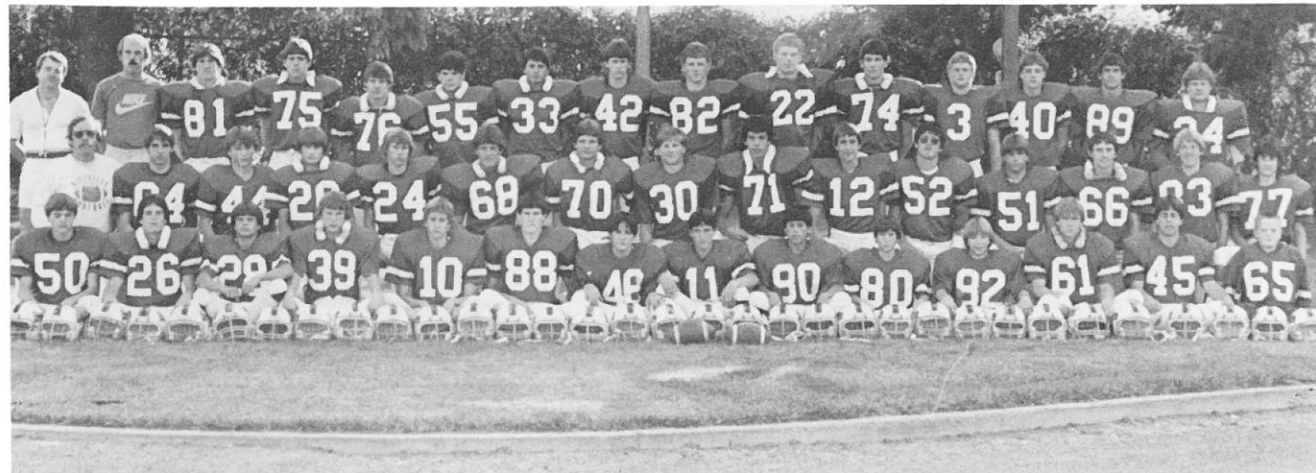

Football season 1984 was a smashing success for the Ritzville Broncos. They had an offense that was lightning quick and could score from anywhere on the field. Led by quarterback Keith Humphrey, running backs Doug Koch and Doug Wellsandt, receivers Steve Adams, Jeff McBroom, and Ben Stevens; the Broncos scored quickly and often. When their opponents had the ball, the defense; led by linemen David Harder, Miles Curtis and Eric Ottmar, linebackers John Powers and Matt Koch, and defensive backs Ken Cooper, Mike Hartman and John Dill harassed ballcarriers, caused turnovers, and kept the opposition off the scoreboard. Though the Broncos took a fall in the State Semi-Finals, they accomplished a number of GREAT things. Among them were: the first Bicounty team to go undefeated and untied since 1978. The first Bronco undefeated league season since 1966. The first undefeated regular season for a Bronco football team since 1966, and a #1 rank in the state polls all year long. This Bronco team played a lot of great football in 1984.
